FLLC welcomes people of all faiths and all ages, during all seasons.



## Adopting Congregation or individuals agree to:

- \* make a three year commitment to the project.
- \* bring volunteers to clean up, repair, and improve the adopted building or area of camp.
- \* provide funds for cabin/project (i.e. \$1,000 for a cabin over the three year commitment just a dollar a day!), with at least semi-annual installments.

When making arrangements to work on your project the camp needs to know:

- Approved designs, colors, etc. of project work (see camps responsibilities)
- The contact person
- The number of volunteers
- The skill level of the leader and volunteers
- •The type of equipment the group is bringing
- A mutually acceptable date

## Fortune Lake Lutheran Camp agrees to:

- \* Provide a list detailing the many camp buildings and projects needing sponsorship.
- \* Annually inspect adopted buildings to let sponsors know of needed repairs.
- \* Provide specifications on design, color, etc. of an adoptive project to be sure it fits into the overall camp scheme.
- \* Maintain funds for the specified Adopt-A-Cabin/Project in a restricted account at FLLC to purchase maintenance materials for their adopted project.
- \* Provide for the volunteers while at camp:
  - Materials previously paid for by adopter
  - Safety program (barricades, over seer)
  - A waste management and clean up plan
  - Meals for the volunteers
  - Housing if working multiple days
